The Flower Show was very well attended (an estimated 800-900 attendees) and the venue (Chesapeake College) worked out beautifully. There was lots of

garden club participation, the entries were wonderful, creative and diverse, the workshops essentially standing room only andI could go one and on. Thank you to everyone (list is too long to name) who made these events the successes they were. You'll see photos and hear more about the events in this issue.

I do want to acknowledge the winners of multiple top Flower Show Awards from our District:

- Susie Middleton, member of Dorchester, Oxford and Talbot County GCs and incoming president of FGCMD, walked away with the Award of Horticultural Excellence, The Grower's Choice Award the Susan B. Whitaker Perpetual Award for her most creative Petite Design! An incredible showing on her part.
- <u>Frances Follmer</u> of Somerset and Four Seasons GCs won the Award of Design Excellence and the Designer's Choice Awards.
- Ann Street, also of Somerset and Four Seasons, won multiple awards as well—the
 Design Petite Award and the Evelyn Williams/Joanna Cato Perpetual Award for the blue
 ribbon design which demonstrated the most creativity.

Well done ladies! All three of these exhibitors are Flower Show judges having completed the NGC Flower Show School.

- Carolyn MacGlashan, Chairman of the Flower Show and member of Queen Anne's GC apparently didn't have enough to do with her chairmanship duties so she also entered the show and was awarded the District Director's Award for the Gourd Growing Challenge and an Award of Merit for Horticulture.
- Congratulations as well to Pamela Keaton, Sandy Wrightson, April Walter, Karen Collins, Monica Mooney, Jackie Davies, Robin Lanham, Karin Brimar, Paula Kumar, Julia Miller, Carol Jelich, Jane Thompson, Gail Willin, Laura Blaylock, Susan Coomer and Nancy Bennington—all of whom won top awards. Thank you and congratulations to all those who entered, whether you won a ribbon or not, as you so positively reflect the talents of District I gardeners and designers.

At our **Semi-annual Meeting**, Sylvia Deck created numerous designs for holiday celebrations from Halloween to New Year's Day. She wowed us with her vibrant color choices, some unusual floral material (like an amazing purple anthurium, gorgeous coral roses and stunning blue delphinieum) and some of the most creative containers--including a fish poacher! She finds many of her containers at thrift or discount shops and her large, three-tiered urns were purchased at Aldi!

Sylvia was very generous with her designs and what she made available for raffle to a number of very lucky members! Our 50-50 raffle yielded a pot over \$500—for the winner (same amount for our District) and over \$1000 were raised in the club raffle in which all ten clubs donated lovely prizes.

Congratulations to Pat Jessup for winning the District's Perennial Bloom award and to Anne Foss who was awarded the Joanna Tilghman award. Both well-deserving winners serve on the current District Board.

In addition, a number of people received **District Director's Certificates of Appreciation** for their various contributions: Susie Middleton and Terry Holman for producing excellent video training programs on horticulture and design flower show entries; Diana Bonner for the Kent Island Gold Star Dedication Program; Carol Jelich for organizing our very successful field trip to Salisbury University Arboretum, Carolyn MacGlashan for her superb chairmanship of Harvest Highlights, Ellen Higgins for serving as 'team photographer' for our various events and Michelle Hall, Event Manager at Chesapeake College, who so ably assisted and supported in the planning and execution of our Flower Show.

Also at the Semi-annual meeting, we asked attendees to contribute 'loose change' (more like dollar bills!) to **Penny Pines** so that we could contribute funds to reforest national parks sites in Florida after the recent catastrophic hurricane. I'm pleased to say we will be making **two** separate contributions based on the funds raised--\$68.00 for each contribution. Thank you to all those that donated to this worthy, emergency cause. I encourage all clubs to consider passing the Penny Pines jar so that you can make your own donations to the cause of your choice.

The District and some clubs have donated in the past in memory of deceased members, but you can also choose to honor someone by planting new trees through the NGC Penny Pines Program.

Once again, after a hiatus of a couple of years due to Covid, the **State House Display of Trees and Wreaths** created by garden clubs is back on. This program was created by Governor and Mrs. Hogan but, as Governor Hogan cannot run for re-election, we do not know if the next Governor will continue with the display. I'm pleased to say that nearly all our clubs are participating and the two counties on the Shore not being represented will likely have an entry created by one of our members so no one will be left out. Set-up for the display is November 28th and 29th. I encourage you to stop by during the month of December to view all the beautiful, creative trees.
